2023 Training Hours Policy

- No longer using the Temporary Training Policy's developed during Covid
- Following CMOP Guidelines on Basic and Advanced Training Hours via Web
 - \circ Done with the anticipation for chapters to return to in-person training basic and advanced
 - CMOP Section 4.1 Basic and 5.5 for Advanced for reference
 - 5.5 excerpt: "Members are *encouraged* to obtain the bulk of their AT hours in live classroom settings or in live online training that includes an opportunity for communication with the instructor."
 - No cap, min or max for AT hours earned online vs in-person.

• TMNTuesdays

- \circ $\,$ Allowed AT hours watched live or as recording
- \circ $\;$ Log hours based on calendar year the event happened live
- i.e 2022 TMNTuesdays watched live or as a recording will only count for 2022 AT hours.

• 2022 Annual Meeting

- Allowed AT hours for recordings up to 90 days post event
- Log hours based on date/year the recording was watched
- Post 90 days ended January 23
- 2023 Annual Meeting
 - Will be changing recording watch length to the calendar year for AT hours

- Scam we heard of in 2021 & 2022:
 - Directors email addresses were on website and scammers were emailing under the name of directors to others in the chapter asking for information or funds.
 - Gift card scam
 - Bank account access
 - "I need a favor" scam

• OPTIONS:

- $\circ~$ Let your members know that you will not ask for these things via TMN emails
- Put directors email list behind password protected page, or on an external share drive
- Add forms for contacting chapter & use CAPTCHA option
- Send out directors' email list to chapter members once in external email at beginning of year
- How else?
- When in doubt call person emailing!
- How does your public audience contact your chapter for information?
