




#### **New Account Manager**

### Beware of Phishing/Scam Issues

#### Scam we heard of the past couple years:

- o Directors names and email addresses spoofed and appear to be asking others in the chapter for information or funds.
  - Gift card scam
  - Bank account access
  - "I need a favor" scam
  - through email and/or text messages

#### Options:

- o Let your members know that you will never ask for these things via TMN emails
- O Make it your chapter practice and policy (and make it known) that you only 'do business' (like this) during official business meetings, never over email or text
- o Put directors email list behind password protected page, or on an external share drive
- o Add forms for contacting chapter & use CAPTCHA option
- o Send out directors' email list to chapter members once in external email at beginning of year
- o How else?
- When in doubt call person emailing!

#### TEXAS MASTER NATURALIST PROGRAM

Since 1997

There were 718 new members trained in 2022 and more than 16,330 members have been trained to date. Members contributed 515,454 hours of service to the TMN Program in 2022 and more than 6.38 million hours to date. In 2022, TMN Members contributed more service hours than any other program year!

#### MISSION



The Texas Master Naturalist Program's mission is to develop a corps of well-informed volunteers to provide education, outreach, and service dedicated to the beneficial management of natural resources and natural areas within their communities for the State of Texas.

#### ABOUT

What makes the work of a Master Naturalist so important is that they are not only individuals who love nature and offer their time, but are also trained naturalists with specialized knowledge of different ecosystems, species, habitats, and environmental demands. Our skilled volunteers work with communities and organizations across 48 chapters covering 213 counties to implement youth outreach programs, help operate parks, nature centers, natural areas, and lead local natural resource conservation efforts.

#### OTHER PROGRAM IMPACTS

Reached over 289,969 youth, adults, and private landowners in 2022 and more than 6.864 million people to date.

Developed or maintained 62 NEW miles of trail in 2022 and more than 2,296+ miles of trail to date.

Commander Kjell Lindgren, also a TMN volunteer, took our patch and pin to space on the ISS as part of NASA's Crew-4. Service hours in 2022 were valued at \$11.85 million and more than \$146.80 million since the program's inception.

Added 40 acres under TMN stewardship and management projects in 2022 and made an impact on more than 233,943 acres of Texas to date.

### Our Goal

• To form a financial support organization for the Texas Master Naturalist program to alleviate any financial and logistical concerns from both sponsoring state agencies (Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension)



### General Proposal

- Will be a 501(c)3 corporation
- Immediate responsibilities:
  - Collect and disburse funds for annual meeting (currently ~\$125,000 each year)
  - Assist sponsors to plan annual meeting as needed
- Developing with guidance and approval from both sponsoring agencies
- Name: Friends of Texas Master Naturalist



### Why Do We Need This?

Federal grant that funds Texas Master Naturalist Program prohibits making a profit

- No selling allowed
- Auditors view any meeting overages as profit
- Sponsors' state purchasing card rules disallow paying invoices to another state organization (would allow payments to Friends organization)









Annual Meeting 100% self-funded from registrations and sponsorships Leftover funds used for next year's meeting

Friends budget to segregate funds for Annual Meeting from other items






Fiscal responsibility for Annual Meeting that supports all chapters Annual Meeting funds in AgriLife account to be transitioned to Friends account

FAQ: Will this organization raise money to pay for the Annual Meeting?

### FAQ: Will the Friends organization govern the chapters?

No, will not have oversight and governance of chapters, i.e. not a chapter-of-chapters

Michelle, Mary Pearl and staff to continue as State Office



FAQ: What is the relationship between the current **Endowment and** License Plate funds and future Friends organization?

No plans to change ownership of either fund

Friends may include future fundraising efforts and informing plans for both



#### Initial budget: \$2,115

All fees are estimates based on state incorporation and non-profit 501(c)3 status

\$40 fee for Reservation of Entity Name (Texas)

\$25 fee for Certificate of Formation (Texas)

\$25 fee for Application for Registration to do Business (Texas)

\$600 Fee for IRS 501(c)3 filing (Federal)

\$600 Fees for any professional assistance

(\$200/hourx3hours)\*

\$25/year website domain name

\$150-200/year webhosting

\$50 postage

\$50 basic office supplies

\$500 bank account\*

- Apply for a Federal Employer Identification Number and establish bank account (by end of 2023)
- Prepare Federal Tax-Exemption Application
- Apply for Sales, Franchise and Hotel Tax-Exemption from Texas Comptroller




