We currently **do not** have a statewide Junior Master Naturalist **program** due to a lack of funding.

However, some chapters have developed their own Junior Master Naturalist **projects** and can be contacted for assistance in developing a project for your chapter.

#### What is the history of the Junior Master Naturalist interest?

Interest has been in building a youth facing program since the beginning of the TMN adult program. Various projects have been taken throughout the 25-year history of the program – including:

- visiting sabbatical professor who developed curriculum resources,
- interns who have built resource toolboxes,
- contracted help to write program proposals using formal surveys,
- writing grant letters when funding opportunities are present,
- Annual Meeting roundtables and workshop groups,
- and more . . . .

A formal survey and resource gathering project was last done in 2016 and 2012. At that time - 59% of Master Naturalist chapters' work with youth, targeting youth in early elementary (80%), older elementary (73%) and middle school (60%). Only 13.3% of these efforts involve high school age youth. Most programs consist of monthly or short-term intensive programs. Events take place in public schools, city or county parks, state parks, and to a lesser extent, in private schools, boy and girl scouts, and other venues.



#### Why is forming a statewide Junior Master Naturalist program important?

To establish consistency for the program, through consistent branding, messaging, and curriculum across the program.

To build sustainable resources for chapters when member/volunteer leads change

To develop resources for chapters, including program guidelines, curriculum and youth protection standards

Developing programs for youth is different -

To develop liability considerations and youth programming safety resources



#### **Next Steps**

The next steps for developing a Junior Master Naturalist Program would be to fund a full-time position dedicated to developing resources and a full program.

This position would build a JMN resource toolbox and curricula, finalize JMN guidelines with inputs from current youth programs within the TMN program, pilot test training, and then refine and expand the JMN program.

Our goal is to build financial resources (such as through the Texas Master Naturalist Endowment) or seek other support opportunities for these financial resource needed.


