How is the Texas Master Naturalist Program funded?

The TMN Program costs about \$250k annually to administer the program

- → 3 full time employees + 3-5 part time employees
- → Does not include chapter advisors

A large portion of these funds come from US Fish & Wildlife Service Wildlife Restoration Program

- originate from excise tax on firearm and ammunition sales
- requires 25% state match

Texas "matches" these funds with a very small portion of the total TMN volunteer service hours. No actual dollars are received from TMN volunteer service hours.

How is the State Program keeping up with growth?

We aren't. And that's a problem.

Many years ago, the program supported 17 chapters with 2 full time staff members

Today, the program supports 49 chapters with 3 full time staff members

We need 5 more full time employees to properly support our chapters and members

In recent years, we have prevented new chapter development and have begun to cut support for some projects just to keep the Program operating.

Doesn't the federal grant cover all expenses?

Not even close.

Some TMN projects and expenses are not eligible for this funding, so the TMN state Program must find other funds to pay for:

Service and milestone pins

Deposits for annual meeting

Covering unmet costs from Annual Meeting, if any

Project grants to chapters (when offered)

Fundraising for long term program viability

Sponsorships to reduce registration costs of Annual Meeting

Extension and TPWD staff that advise and support Chapters, volunteers

Junior Master Naturalist Program, or any other youth programming

What about the Annual Meeting?

The Annual Meeting is a training event

The Annual Meeting cost about \$200-250k each year

If an Annual Meeting generated profit, funds are used to pay for future meetings

Annual Meeting funds are over-allocated

There's not enough to pay for 2 years worth of deposits + 1 year of meeting costs

Sponsor Agencies must cover any deficit not met by registration

Or Registration prices would have to increase

- Admin's "Add/Delete" button removed (Expectation = New trainees create their own TMN VMS Profiles)
- Samaritan auto log out shortened to 15 mins after no activity
- TMN Roles created and readied for move, consolidation
- Next step is moving and consolidation with the TPWD main account (aka "life without folders")
 - Ofor Chapter Admins, this will not be a big change
 - Ochapters will use grids and filters to organize info vs. information in folders
 - OWe expect this to happen "soon" (*still have not been given dates)
 - OWe will give as much advance notice as we are given
 - O Information and training will be provided as soon as we are made aware

VMS Training & Help Desk Updates

- Moratorium on VMS Trainings July-August
- Contact the VMS Help Desk for emergencies (ie. You lose your chapter Admins)

AGAIN:

Nothing changing for our end users (reporting volunteers) at this time.

Proceed with entering hours as normal

TMN VMS Updates – What's Next?

<u>Next Phase (After our account is moved and consolidated) (Timeframe TBD) (Rumors = Oct-Dectimeframe)</u>

- Anticipating similar "application"/entry process in the system as now (application updated in August?)
- Development/Implementation of a new "Onboarding" Training Module for volunteers
 - O New volunteers would work through a few "need to know" modules to fully be accepted (applied) to the program pre-training class
- HEADS UP that the Opportunity 'sign ups' for chapters will be moving to an "Opt In" vs the "Opt Out" process that it is now.
- Development and Implementation of our "Org Module"
- Development and Implementation of our "Prerequisites" (=if/then movements through onboarding) process
- MFA will be added for chapter admins using the system (last item Samaritan will build and implement)

TMN VMS Updates – Reminders

Reminders:

- This is not a complete system rebuild and overhaul
- We are implementing new features and modules of the Samaritan system that were not available before
- Our VMS Team has been involved in weekly(+) meetings, 2xs per week now
- Our VMS Team has been and will be involved in providing input to the re-build development and testing
- We will have training sessions for VMS admins, members when we know more and the time comes (TBD)
- For EXISTING members the basic volunteer reporting experience shouldn't be too different from what you see now.


